



## IV Contrast Discharge Instructions

This is an IV contrast that is used to help the radiologist see images of your child more clearly.

To help your child flush the contrast from his body, it is important to give him extra fluids today.

Contrast reactions rarely occur. It is important to watch your child for the following symptoms for the next 48 hours.

- Hives or other skin rash
- Itching
- Wheezing
- Nausea and/or vomiting
- Difficulty breathing
- Difficulty swallowing

**Call 911 if your child is having difficulty breathing or swallowing.**

**If your child has any of these symptoms, you need to let us know immediately.**
